Southside Spring Garage Sale

Southside's next Garage Sale at the Mt Gravatt Centre will be held on **Saturday 9 September from 7am to 12noon**. Save the date in your calendar and come along, whether to help or to shop, and enjoy the friendly atmosphere. These events are the face of Southside to the local community.



As always, Southside will be donating 50% of the profits. This time, we are partnering with Orange Sky. Our donation will provide funding for a replacement dryer. Surplus funding will provide a number of laundry and shower services.

Orange Sky is based in Brisbane and provides a regular laundry and shower service to every day Australians. Their focus is on creating a safe, positive and supportive environment for people who are too often ignored or who feel disconnected from the community. The volunteers are not social workers or experts on homelessness – they are sympathetic listeners and great conversationalists.

Orange Sky continues Southside's theme of helping the homeless and follows our Backpack Bed for Homeless recipient from March. The covid pandemic and now the steeply rising cost of living are seeing more people and families struggling to put a roof over their heads and forcing them to make tough decisions regarding whether to feed themselves or pay bills. In a small but effective way, supporting Orange Sky with a replacement dryer will help many people and bring a sense of dignity to them.

HymnFest - Songs of Revival!

As you can imagine, it will take us quite a few months to be able to showcase each ministry. We hope you enjoy finding out a bit more about what is happening.

Timor Children's Foundation

East Timor is one of Australia's closest neighbours and is a nation which has faced decades of oppression and violence and continues to be on the list of least developed nations in the world. At most risk are the children [& half the population of 1.4 million is under the age of 18, and many of those are malnourished].

A specific focus for The Timor Children's Foundation [established in 2002] has been providing assistance to orphans and young adults. There are over 40 children's homes in East Timor. Children are often placed in these facilities because their families are too poor to look after them.

Many families are also too poor to pay for their children's education, and so the foundation has been providing scholarships to help children get an education to become the future professional and leaders of their society.

The foundation also assists with some basic medical care issues including dental care , but the level of medical care continues to be far below that in Australia with the infant mortality rate being 10 times higher than here.

A great way to assist the foundation work [which is done on a not for profit basis, with very low overheads, and is interdenominational] is to donate money to their work. One of the best ways to do this is to make sure you attend the annual lunch held to raise funds. This year that lunch will be held on 9 September at the Gap Uniting Church from 12 noon until 2pm at a cost of \$25 per person. A guest speaker will be attending and a light lunch is provided. You can be sure all monies received will get to their intended destination and will be used for their intended purpose.
